



Welcome to all who are gathered for worship! If you are a visitor, we are glad to have you with us and we hope you will come again. Please note that today's entire service is found in this bulletin.

A child's verse declares "God loves us all, both big and small." As we hear today's gospel story of Zacchaeus we are told that the sins of the world are covered. We are able to stand tall before God our righteous judge because in the person of Jesus "salvation has come to this house"—to our house today. In Christ Jesus God seeks us out to save us. Communion: As Lutheran Christians, the presence of God in word and sacrament is central to our worship life. God's **word** proclaimed and the **sacraments**- both Holy Baptism and Holy Communion- are called the *means of grace*. We believe that Jesus Christ is present in these means through the power of the Holy Spirit. As we gather around the Lord's table for communion, everyone is invited to come. All baptized Christians are welcome to receive communion. Those not receiving communion may come forward and receive a blessing.

Worship is fundamentally about what God is doing and our response to God's action. Worship is an encounter with God, who saves us through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Again, welcome!

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight.




²¹But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, ²³since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; ²⁴they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; ²⁶it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.



The Joint Declaration on the Doctrine of Justification is a document created and agreed to by the Catholic Church's Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and the Lutheran World Federation in 1999 as a result of extensive ecumenical dialogue. It states that the churches now share "a common understanding of our justification by God's grace through faith in Christ." To the parties involved, this essentially resolves the 500-year-old conflict over the nature of justification which was at the root of the Protestant Reformation. As a member of the Lutheran World Federation, the ELCA was a part of this historic process. Every year the ELCA's Ecumenical and Inter-Religious Relations staff participate in study and dialog with other religious partners. Your gifts to the church help to make this important work possible. 




