
The Congregational Meeting will be held on **Sunday, January 21st**, directly following the 9:30am worship service. After the meeting we will be having a luncheon to celebrate the "burning of the mortgage." You may be wondering why the meeting is a bit later than is typical for Good Shepherd. This fall the Church Council began the process of preparing the 2024 Annual Budget. After a review of the initial draft from the Finance team, it was agreed that council members would go back to their committees to see if expenses might be reduced for the coming year. Next the Council looked carefully at our current and historical income so that projections might be as accurate as possible. We believe that taking this additional time was an important part of a healthy process. The new budget will be distributed next week.

The Call Committee has had its first two meetings. In December they had a joint meeting with the Transition Team to review the process that was followed to create our Ministry Site Profile. (It's kind of like the church's résumé.) At it's second meeting the Committee began working on interview questions in preparation for meeting with pastoral candidates.

One of the trickiest parts of being in the Call Process is that the Committee's work is very confidential. Interview times, candidates names, results of meetings- none of this can be shared with the congregation, the Council or even the very curious Interim Pastor. So while we may all be eager to learn what's happening, we will have to wait for a while longer. What I can tell you is that we have been waiting for the last three months for the congregational audit to be completed before the Committee could receive any candidates' names. This delay was not the fault of the congregation or the auditor, but was caused by a delay in receiving materials from two of our banks. This created a stall in the process which has now been started in earnest.

You may be wondering, "how long must we wait?" I can't really tell you, though I wish that I could. What I can tell you is this. From the time of the initial interview with a candidate until the time they could start serving, varies with every process. In part, this is because pastoral candidates do not want their current congregation to know they are in the call process and because the Committee is made up of volunteers. Getting all of these people together can be tricky. Unforeseen delays can happen due to illness and bad weather. On page five of this newsletter you will find a "Call Process Flow Chart." As you look at it you will find there are a lot of twists and turns, but hopefully it will help to clarify any questions you may have about "what happens next." We are currently approaching the third green box, *Office of Bishop gives names of candidates to Call Committee Chair.*

As the congregation continues to move forward, please keep the Call Committee in your prayers. That's all for now! Hope to see you on Sunday!

Financial Update - November 2023

Receipts: Total Current Receipts through November 2023 were up (+4.5%) compared to the same period in 2022. Adult Receipts (pledged giving) was down (-1.7%). Other Adult Receipts were up (+35.3%). Hall Donations/Rental Fees were up (+18.1%). Mortgage Receipts were down (-12.6%).

Expenses: Total Current Expenses through November 2023 increased by (+15.6%) compared to the same period in 2022. The largest portions of the increased expenses were due to Staff salaries and Property maintenance.
